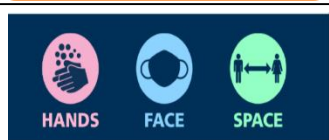

Remember to check the class website for daily videos from the teacher to help with the children's learning.

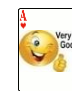

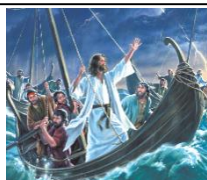

Year 1 loved practising the skills of rolling, pinching, pressing and kneading clay is art.



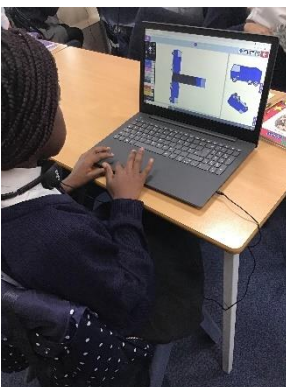
Year 2 loved exploring the life, chronology and historic achievement of local hero Sir John Alcock.
