Nursery have been learning about Remembrance Day this week and observed the 2 minutes silence with their poppies.



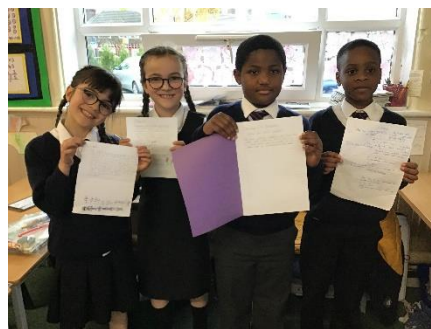
The children in Reception enjoyed making poppies for Remembrance Day.

Year 2 enjoyed exploring the signs and symbols of holy celebration of Shabbat in Judaism. They even got to try some unblessed Challah



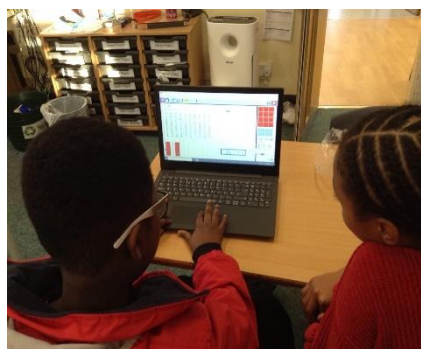
Year 3 have completed some fantastic home learning about Remembrance day, learning why we wear poppies.
