Y4 loved sharing their new knowledge on vertebrate groups and invertebrates



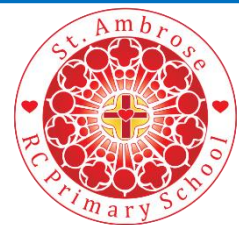
Year 5 loved doing their multi-media art projects inspired by ancient Egypt.
